Step 12 -Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs. From Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, p106, p107, p109

The joy of living is the theme of A.A.'s Twelfth Step, and action is its key word. Here we turn outward toward our fellow alcoholics who are still in distress. Here we experience the kind of giving that asks no rewards. Here we begin to practice all Twelve Steps of the program in our daily live so that we and those about us may find emotional sobriety. When the Twelfth Step is seen in its full implication, it is really talking about the kind of love that has no price tag on it. Our Twelfth Step also says that as a result of practicing all the Steps, we have each found something called a spiritual awakening. To new A.A.'s, this often seems like a very dubious and improbable state of affairs... When a man or a woman has a spiritual awakening, the most important meaning of it is that he has now become able to do, feel, and believe that which he could not do before on his unaided strength and resources alone. He has been granted a gift which amounts to a new state of consciousness and being. He has been set on a path which tells him he is really going somewhere, that life is not a dead end, not something to be endured or mastered. In a very real sense he has been transformed, because he has laid hold of a source of strength which, in one way or another, he had hitherto dénied himself... Now, what about the rest of the Twelfth Step? The wonderful energy it releases, and the eager action by which it carries our message to the next suffering alcoholic and which finalTradition 12 - Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities. The spiritual substance of anonymity is sacrifice. Because A.A's Twelve Traditions repeatedly ask us to give up personal desires for the common good, we realize that the sacrificial spirit - well symbolized by anonymity - is the foundation of them all. It is A.A.'s proved willingness to make these sacrifices that gives people their high confidence in our future.

From November 25th, Daily Reflections A POWERFUL TRADI-TION - In the years before the publication of the book, "Alcoholics Anonymous", we had no name... By a narrow majority the verdict was for naming our book "The Way Out." ... One of our early lone members...found exactly twelve books already titled "The Way Out." ... So Alcoholics Anonymous" became first Choice. That's how we got a name for our book of experience, a name for our movement and, as we are now beginning to see, a tradition of the greatest spiritual import. "A.A. Tradition: How It Developed", pp. 35-36 Beginning with Bill's momentous decision to Akron to make a telephone call rather than a visit to the hotel bar, how often has a Higher Power made itself felt at crucial moments in our history! The eventual importance that the principle of anonymity would acquire was but dimly perceived, if at all, in those early days. There seems to have been an element of chance even in the choice of a name for our Fellowship. God is no stranger to anonymity and often appears in human affairs in the guises of "luck," "chance," or "coincidence." If anonymity, somewhat fortuitously, became the spiritual basis for all of our Traditions, perhaps God was acting anonymously on our behalf.

CONCEPT TWELVE

"The Conference shall observe the spirit of A.A. tradition, taking care that it never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds and reserve be its prudent financial principle; that it place none of its members in a position of unqualified authority over others; that it reach all important decisions by discussion, vote, and, whenever possible, by substantial unanimity; that its actions never be personally punitive nor an incitement to public controversy; that it never perform acts of government, and that, like the Society it serves, it will always remain democratic in thought and action."

How do we guard against becoming a "seat of perilous wealth or power"? □ How do we practice prudent use of our Seventh Tradition contributions and literature revenue? □ Do we insure the spiritual liberties of all A.A. members by not placing any member in the position of absolute authority over others? □ Do we try to reach important decisions by thorough discussion, vote and, where possible, substantial unanimity? □ As guardians of A.A.'s traditions, are we ever justified in being personally punitive? □ Are we careful to avoid public controversy? □ Do we always try to treat each other with mutual respect and love?
